## Camp Robin Hood Immunization Policy

This policy outlines immunization requirements for campers and staff to ensure the health and safety of everyone at Camp Robin Hood. This policy aligns with school board guidelines and Ontario Public Health recommendations (<https://www.ontario.ca/page/vaccines-children-school>) and is subject to change according to provincial recommendations.

We strive to ensure that camp is a healthy and safe environment for all. As such, we **require** campers and staff to be vaccinated according to the Ontario Routine Immunization Schedule <https://www.ontario.ca/page/ontarios-routine-immunization-schedule>. As part of our commitment to health and safety, Camp Robin Hood asks all staff and campers to provide their immunization status through the health form, which can be accessed via the Registration Portal.

## Vaccination Exemptions

There are two types of vaccination exemptions: non-medical exemptions (for philosophical or conscience-based beliefs) and medical exemptions (for those who cannot receive vaccines due to medical reasons). If you are exempt from vaccines, please indicate this on your health form.

The health and safety of all campers and staff is our top priority. If you are not fully up to date with your vaccines, you are considered **not fully immunized and must indicate this on the staff or camper health form**. While we respect personal health choices, it's important to understand how this may affect your participation at camp.

## Outbreak Control

If a vaccine-preventable disease outbreak occurs, non-immunized staff and campers may be required to leave camp for the duration of the outbreak, as advised by Public Health. Staff will be placed on unpaid leave and there will be no fee adjustments for campers.

These measures are to protect both non-immunized individuals and those who may be vulnerable due to health issues or immunosuppression.
